MIKE SUHRE,PGA SERVING THE YOUTH & GROWING THE GAME

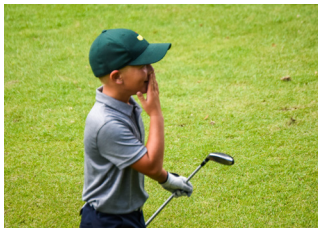

YOUTH PILLAR



PGA REACH Gateway understands the significant role that the game of golf has in positively impacting and shaping the lives of our community's youth. In 2020, the Youth Pillar persevered through adversity to continue to serve as the "Home for Junior Golf" for our community's youth. PGA REACH Gateway provided social distancing, friendly and safe programming for local junior golfers through PGA Jr. League, the Gateway PGA Junior Tour, and the Gateway PGA Jr. Development Tour.

CLARENCE VOIGT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Each year, PGA REACH Gateway grants a limited number of college scholarships to high school graduates through the Clarence Voigt Memorial Scholarship Fund. Clarence loved working with junior golfers and was a talented teacher. To honor his contributions to golf and to perpetuate his legacy, Clarence's family and friends have created a scholarship fund in his name for those young people who embody the same character traits. Since the Scholarship Fund was established in 2011, PGA REACH Gateway has awarded \$27,250 in Clarence Voigt Memorial Scholarships.

Throughout 2020, the PGA REACH Gateway community continued fundraising in support of the impact of the Clarence Voigt Memorial Scholarship Fund. The City Championship took place on July 25-26th at Forest Park Golf Course. St. Clair Country Club also successfully hosted its annual Clarence Voigt Memorial Senior Scramble on August 18th to raise funds. These efforts were largely made possible through the generosity of St. Clair Country Club's members and through the dedication of Gateway Section PGA Professionals, Tom Stipula, PGA and JT Tiereny, PGA.



PGA Jr. League

Each year the PGA of America helps make PGA Jr. League accessible to all families by providing player scholarships on a need basis. This year, 241 juniors in the Gateway Section were provided scholarships. PGA Jr. League programs throughout the Gateway Section served as a safe, positive, and fun recreational environment for families throughout our community.

PGA Junior Tour & JDT

Despite COVID-19, the Gateway PGA Junior Tour and Junior Development Tour provided a full summer schedule of safe and competitive tournaments for local junior golfers. To top off a successful 2020 Season, the Gateway PGA Junior Tour and 8 local PGA Professionals stepped in to host a "Gateway PGA High School Championship" for the many high school students whose 2020 post-season was canceled. The Junior Tour provided a great experience for 96 Illinois and Missouri high school golfers that participated. The event took place on November 7-8th at Spencer T. Olin Golf Course and Sunset Hills Country Club.

Maine has hosted the PGA HOPE Cup for the last two years, which has brought more than 80 veterans together to celebrate being a part of PGA HOPE. He even employs a PGA HOPE graduate, Bill Wiegand. Maine participates in Rise Up For HOPE where he donates money from regripping clubs back to PGA HOPE. Even with all that he does, he still takes time to help teach PGA HOPE clinics in the St. Louis Metro area. Maine has been a champion for PGA HOPE since programming began in 2012, and continues to be a driving force behind its success.

Going Above & Beyond For Veterans

Jon DePriest is a PGA Professional that goes above and beyond to help grow PGA HOPE. DePriest is the Director of Golf at Sunset Hills Country Club in Edwardsville, IL. Through programs like Rise Up for HOPE, The Five Star Challenge, and The Global Brew Tournament, DePriest has raised over \$30,000. In addition to the funds raised, DePriest helps teach PGA HOPE clinics through the St. Louis Metro program.

The Gift of Giving

In December, Dr. Ralph G Dacey Jr. donated a solo rider cart to PGA HOPE's veterans in honor of his late father who served as a Navy Veteran. Dr. Dacey is the Henry G. and Edith R. Schwartz Professor of Neurological Surgery at the Washington University of St. Louis School of Medicine. Dr. Dacey's donation exemplifies what PGA HOPE stands for in helping better the mental, physical, emotional and social wellbeing of veterans through the game of golf.

2020 Patriot Award Recipient



Lance Flury has been named the 2020 Patriot Award Winner. This award is given to a PGA Golf Professional who personifies patriotism through the game of golf and demonstrates commitment to the men and women who serve the United States of America. Flury is a PGA Professional at Lincoln Greens Golf Course and an Air Force Veteran. He is also the lead professional for the Springfield PGA HOPE Program, and in 2020, he was able to hold a fall clinic where 15 veterans participated.

BOB ROSNER

2020 Veteran of the Year



The 2020 Veteran of the Year is Bob Rosner, a 2018 graduate of the Gateway PGA HOPE program. Rosner served 14 years in the Army before retiring. After completing the PGA HOPE program, Rosner has been President of the Arlington Greens Veterans Golf Association, and has worked with the PGA of America on various championships. Rosner has made it his mission to educate and inform other veterans across the country about PGA HOPE.

INCLUSION PILLAR

Youth & Community Complex

PGA REACH Gateway is in the process of transforming a 23-acre EPA Super Fund industrial site on North Grand Blvd, one of St. Louis' most at-risk neighborhoods. Phase One began in 2014 as a 7-acre driving range. In partnership with the adjacent Herbert Hoover Boys & Girls Club, the property will be developed into a Youth & Community Complex with opportunities that include golf. New Partner Spotlight: Urban Golf of Greater St. Louis

PGA REACH Gateway believes that golf is more about the community that plays it than the game itself. By partnering with organizations like Urban Golf St. Louis (UGolf), PGA REACH Gateway can accomplish the mission of improving lives through the community of golf. UGolf is an organization that works with youth to help them navigate school and everyday life; through golf education, after school programs, and individual student support.



Q&A with UGOLF Student Lee Curtis

In what ways has UGOLF positively impacted your life?

"Even though we are living in a pandemic currently, my short time with UGOLF has been amazing. Having some prior knowledge about golf, connecting that with life, and learning more about the game has opened my mind to wanting to see more outside of the Saint Louis Area."

Name one thing that Jerome Harris (UGOLF President) or a UGOLF mentor has taught you?

"Jerome and Alex both have taught me to always be honest with yourself. To make sure you always give back to your community or to the ones who are in desperate need."

Do you see yourself pursuing golf after graduating from the UGOLF program?

If I had the opportunity to play golf outside of UGOLF at a higher level, then I would.

What would you like to tell a younger student about getting involved with UGOLF/ the game of golf?

"UGOLF is not just about golf, but it is about mentally and physically helping you with any circumstances that you are facing. It provides you with the academic needs in order to be a successful student."

Best Buy Teen Tech Center

The Herbert Hoover Boys & Girls Club is the home of the Best Buy Teen Tech Center. Through our partnership, they continue to have programming that leads to great success stories. One example of their programming is a six-week virtual music studio program to utilize sound booth technology within the Best Buy Teen Tech Center. This was an incredible real-world application for the students as they produced music on equipment that can be found in a professional studio. Each week was used to show members a different part of the music creation process. They would learn through a short lecture, screen sharing, and live examples. Once they finished the introduction process each member was sent a link to interact with the program.

A highlight of the program was when Jordan R. and other members of the HH Boys & Girls Club partnered with the Teen Center for Excellence music team to write and produce a song. Members virtual and in person were able to collaborate and direct Jordan while he was in the physical studio. The song was able to be mixed and shared between the two teams and was a show of true collaboration in the virtual space.

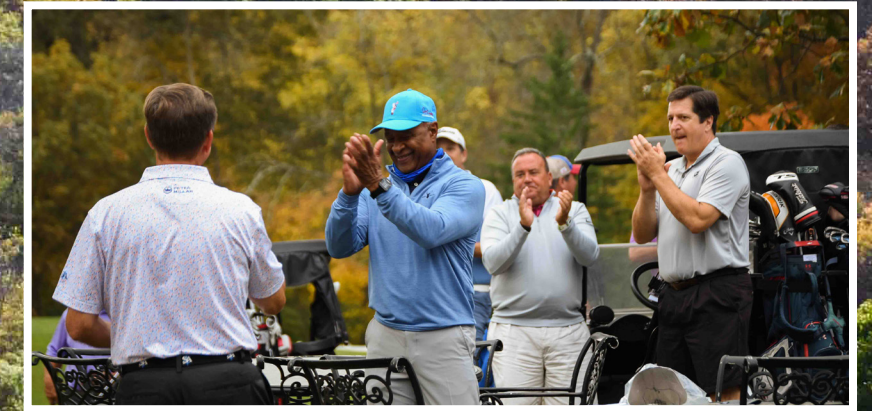

In addition, videos of PGA REACH Gateway's President, Ozzie Smith, played on each golf cart to educate participants without interrupting play. The After Party at the pool deck had food, drinks, and live music by saxophonist, Tim Cunningham. PGA REACH Gateway recognized its Veteran of the Year, Bob Rosner, who continues to support and promote PGA HOPE programming. The night was capped with an in-depth and "unplugged"

conversation between Ozzie Smith, Tom Lawless, John Costello, and Bernard Gilkey, emceed by Mike Claiborne.
